GEOGRAPHY TEACHER

1. SELECTION CRITERIA

Include, but are not limited to:

- commitment to the mission of Catholic education of boys in the Jesuit tradition;
- An understanding of the educational needs of boys and young men;
- strong understanding of relevant curriculum requirements of the NSW Educational Standards Authority (NESA);
- appropriate Secondary teaching qualifications, specifically Geography, and eligibility to teach under the requirements of NESA, NSW legislation and College policy;
- demonstrated experience in teaching Stage 6, Preliminary and HSC Geography is essential and experience in HSC Geography marking would be an advantage;
- demonstrated knowledge and skills to develop and implement relevant fieldwork;
- demonstrated knowledge and skills to mentor students through major research projects including the Senior Geography Project;
- ability and willingness to engage students as partners in their learning, which may include negotiation of content, case studies and assessment tasks based on student interests and learning needs;
- demonstrated experience with spatial and other technologies and their integration into all courses;
- ability to engage external partners in the Geography programs, within and beyond the College community;
- demonstrated experience teaching both Mandatory and Elective Geography 7-10;
- ability to design, implement and evaluate curriculum collaboratively in accordance with College and NESA syllabus guidelines and outcomes i.e. Mandatory and Elective Geography courses, incorporating geographical knowledge, inquiry and skills;
- proven ability to ensure teaching and learning activities reflect contemporary pedagogy, including the ability to integrate an inquiry-based approach to teaching and learning and differentiation strategies;
- understanding of, and ability to use data to analyse, report on and manage student progress, and to report to parents in a variety of ways that keep them regularly and fully informed of their child's progress;
- ability to create a positive, supportive and engaging classroom climate that meets the academic, social and emotional needs of all students;
- ability and willingness to evaluate and critically reflect upon own professional practice, and continue professional learning, including contributing to the broader school community;
- significant competency in the use of ICT, and its integration into the curriculum;
- (high level of) organisation and time management;
- effective and efficient conflict resolution skills;
- succinct, effective communication (oral and written) skills;
- commitment to participate in the College's pastoral and co-curricular programs.
