SELECTION CRITERIA - MANDARIN TEACHER

We currently have **two** part-time positions available:

- 1 x Primary School Mandarin Teacher (Years 3-6)
- 1 x Secondary School Mandarin Teacher (Years 7-9)

1. SELECTION CRITERIA

Include, but are not limited to:

- commitment to the mission of Catholic education of boys in the Jesuit tradition;
- An understanding of the educational needs of boys and young men;
- strong understanding of relevant curriculum requirements of the NSW Educational Standards Authority (NESA) for Languages (Primary & Secondary);
- appropriate teaching qualifications in Chinese language (Mandarin), specifically Years 3-6 and/or 7-12, and eligibility to teach under the requirements of NESA, NSW legislation and College policy;
- understanding of how students learn languages, especially scripted and tonal languages;
- fluency in Mandarin language;
- ability to teach Years 3-6 or 7-9 Core and Prior learners in a mixed ability classroom is essential;
- ability to teach Years 10-12 Continuers/Extension/in context an advantage for applicants for the secondary school position;
- experience of collaborative planning and a team approach to curriculum design and program development;
- proven ability to ensure teaching and learning activities reflect contemporary pedagogy, including the ability to integrate an inquiry-based approach to teaching and learning and differentiation strategies;
- ability to create and implement quality formative and summative assessments and to report on student learning;
- understanding of, and ability to use data to analyse, report on and manage student progress, and to report to parents in a variety of ways that keep them regularly and fully informed of their child's progress;
- ability to create a positive, supportive and engaging classroom climate that meets the academic, social and emotional needs of all students;
- ability and willingness to evaluate and critically reflect upon own professional practice, continue professional learning, including contributing to the broader school community;
- significant competency in the use of IT, and its integration in curriculum programs;
- (high level of) organization and time management;
- effective and efficient conflict resolution skills;
- succinct, effective communication (oral and written) skills;
- capacity to participate in the pastoral and co-curricular programs of the College.



2. SALARY

These positions are classified under the *Independent Schools NSW/ACT Standards Model (Teachers) St Aloysius' College Enterprise Agreement 2017* as amended or replaced.

3. HOURS/FTE

Part-time (0.5 - 0.6 FTE)

NB: 2 positions available. Each position is required to teach across the 10 day cycle.

4. TERM

Each position is for a 12 month period (2021) with the possibility of extension.
